Hospice Clinician Wages Rising at Slower Rate; Turnover Falling

Wages for hospice clinicians continue to go up amid widespread staff shortages, but they grew at a slower rate in 2023 compared to the prior year. The national average hourly rate for Hospice registered nurses rose 4.58% in 2023, down from a 5.95% increase in 2022, according to a new report by the Hospital & Healthcare Compensation Service in cooperation with the National Association for Home Care & Hospice. Meanwhile, turnover rates declined in 2023, representing the first drop in several years, the report indicated.

This grief therapist draws on her own experience with loss to help others

Claire Bidwell Smith is no stranger to grief. She lost both of her parents to cancer at a young age—her mother when she was 18, and her father when she was 25. "I entered into my adult life with a lot of grief and was just trying to figure out everything that had happened to me. After my mom died, everybody was like 'You'll be fine. You're an adult, just go forward into your life.' And I wasn't fine. It was really, really hard." ... Together, New England College and hospitals aim to tackle nursing vacancies

The state's health care industry had to get creative after the pandemic exacerbated pre-existing workforce shortages, doubling the vacancy rate for nurses and LNAs between 2019 and 2022, according to the New Hampshire Hospital Association. A team of health care leaders developed 107 strategies to recruit and retain workers.

The UnitedHealth Group subsidiary in June penned an agreement to acquire Amedisys in an all-cash transaction of \$101 per share, or about \$3.3 billion. This followed its \$5.4 billion acquisition of LHC Group, which closed in February. Company-wide, value-based care is a driving force behind UnitedHealth Group's growth strategy, according to the company's CEO, Andrew Witty. To further expand this model, the company will need to leverage scale and an expanded suite of services within its health care and insurance businesses. ... UnitedHeal th Group is positioning Optum as a cornerstone of its growing home-based care infrastructure and expansion of value-based service delivery.

Northwell's operating income drops \$104M in Q3

New Hyde Park, N.Y.-based Northwell Health reported a \$103.9 million drop in operating income in the third quarter, from a \$92.4 million gain in the third quarter of 2022 to an \$11.6 million loss in the third quarter of this year, according to financial documents published Nov. 29. Revenue increased 5.8% year over year to \$4.1 billion while expenses increased 8.6% to \$4.2 billion.

Nursing Home Occupancy 'Disappointingly Flat' in November but States' Medicaid Rebasing Encouraging

Healthcare Real Estate Investment Trusts specializing in post-acute care facilities experienced "disappointingly flat" occupancy rates in November, according to investment analysts. BMO Capital Market's Juan Sanabria highlighted the challenges faced by skilled nursing facilities in maintaining growth, with market share loss to home health. ... In terms of REIT exposure and risks, the note pointed out that SNF coverage appeared to have bottomed out as occupancy and labor availability had improved.
